1. Can you relate to this passage- how?
2. What words does David use to describe God?
3. Read Luke 1:67-79. How does this relate?
4. In Luke 1, Zechariah was prophesying about what Christ was going to do- what do you think he meant by “Salvation from our Enemies”- is there a difference between what Zechariah is talking about versus David in 2 Samuel?
5. How did Christ fulfill Zechariah’s prophecy of “Salvation from our enemies?” (Read: Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23 and John 18-19) How is this different then what you would typically expect?
6. What are some ways you can be reminded of the spiritual impact of Christ’s crucifixion even though the physical looks like defeat?

This Weeks Challenge: “Jesus, You saved me from my spiritual enemies by providing me an opportunity to spend my earthly life and eternity with You. Please remind me of this truth. Show me how to focus on the spiritual instead of the physical.- In Jesus Name- Amen.”
