The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; A good understanding have all those who do *His commandments*; His praise endures forever. - Psalm 111:10

1.	Read the entire chapter.
2.	Since this is a Psalm of praise, it would be worth reading out loud. If possible, read it out loud and note the words used for praise.
3.	In verse 10, what is the beginning of wisdom?
4.	Fear in this context means reverence. It's understanding God is bigger, smarter and more powerful than we are. Explain the first time you remember seeing God in this way?
5.	In verse 10, who has a good understanding?
6.	What does it mean to do His commandments? (Matthew 22:34-40, James 1:5)
7.	What is the last statement in verse 10. Why do you think the Psalmist ends this way?
	In what way can you be reminded of God's power, what He desires from you and how He deerves your praise?
